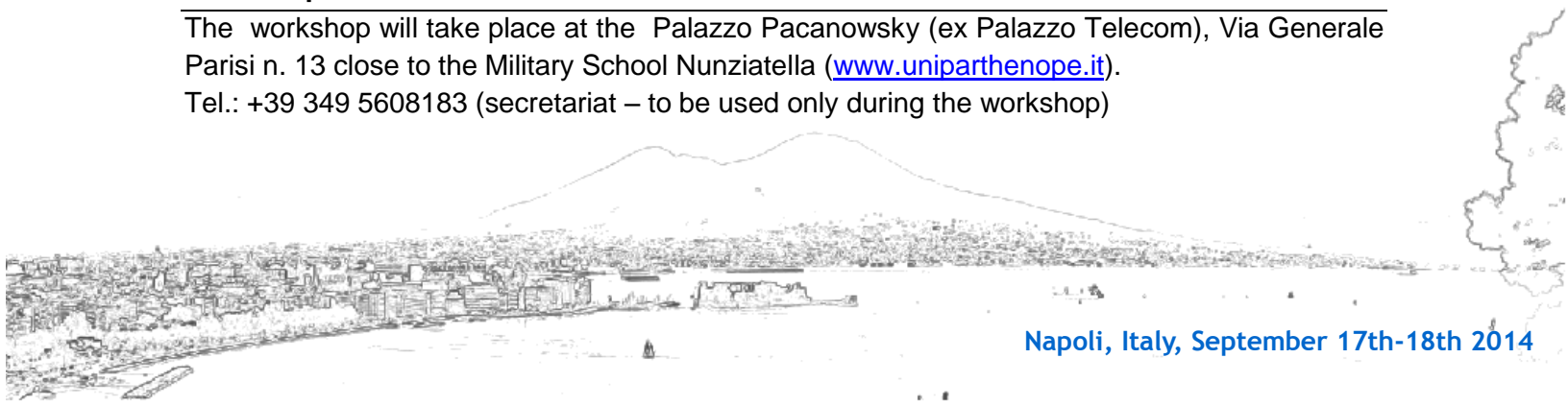

Naples is the capital of the Campania region in Italy. It is the largest city in the South of Italy, and the third largest in Italy. It has a population of about 1 million. It is located halfway between the Vesuvius volcano and a separate volcanic area, the Campi Flegrei, all part of the Campanian volcanic arc. It was founded between the 7th and 6th centuries BC by the Greeks, who gave it the name Neapolis ("New City"). It is rich in historical, artistic and cultural traditions and gastronomy. The Historic Centre of Naples is a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Between 1266 and 1861 Naples has been the capital town of the Kingdom of Naples (later, of the Two Sicilies). This history, coupled with its size, has given Naples the unofficial status of being the Capital of the South (in Italy).

Workshop Venue

The workshop will take place at the Palazzo Pacanowsky (ex Palazzo Telecom), Via Generale Parisi n. 13 close to the Military School Nunziatella (www.uniparthenope.it).

The building was designed by architect David Pacanowsky (1959-66). The U-shaped, rotating around a courtyard open towards the sea, and the technological characteristics of the structures, the attention paid to the municipal gardens with tall trees, lead us to classify the building as an expression of the typical Italian architecture of the '50s.

Palazzo Pacanowsky stands on an area of approximately 35,000 square meters, and it is developed on 11 floors. **The workshop will be held in the AULA 1.1 (room 1.1) on the first floor. The poster session will be held in the same room.** Large lifts which leave the ground floor provide access to all other floors.

Morning sessions will end at 13:00 and there will be a break until 14:00. Buffet lunch as well as coffee breaks will take place on the Terrace at the top of Palazzo Pacanowsky (6th Floor).

Wi-fi access is available for participants in all the areas of the University; please ask for the password at the secretariat desk.

Palazzo Pacanowsky is 20 minutes walking distance from the suggested hotels (approx. 1 km uphill).

The public bus from the Piazza del Plebiscito to reach the venue is line E6 (direction "Piazza dei Martiri") and it takes 5 minutes travelling time (3 stops) to the stop "Monte di Dio". The venue is 2 minutes walking distance (160 m) from the bus stop . Tickets can be purchased beforehand from the vending machines or tobacconists or some news-stand. Mandatory validation on board.

TRANSFERS FROM/TO THE AIRPORT OF NAPLES (distance to/from the city centre 7 km):
Bus service every 20 minutes to/from Piazza Municipio. For information www.anm.it.
